#### **Cleveland Environmental Advocacy Coalition Meeting**

Last month, we brought together partners for our Cleveland Environmental Advocacy Coalition meeting. It was an energizing space to reconnect, lift up community priorities, and strengthen collaboration. The ideas and momentum from that meeting are helping guide how we move forward together into the months ahead.

### Advancing the 2025 Policy Platform

We are also finalizing the 2025 Cleveland Environmental Policy Platform. The updated draft builds on the Climate Action Plan. It introduces new focus areas such as land use and vacant land reuse, innovation and industrial symbiosis, and workforce and economic inclusion, alongside long-standing commitments to water justice, energy equity, transportation, and environmental justice. This platform reflects the priorities of our coalition partners and community members, offering a roadmap for how Cleveland can pursue environmental progress with equity at the center.

Darby Accord: The OEC is working to keep up to date on the Darby Accord and ensure members are aware of how they can make their voice heard to help protect Ohio's biologically diverse streams.

Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease (EHD) & Deer: EHD is on the rise in Ohio, especially in the Southeastern region. The Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) is asking folks to help report instances (or possible instances) of the disease. EHD is not tr ansferable to humans, and Deer can develop more resistance to the disease over time. Still, this is a tough situation with significant implications.
